## WHAT ARE THE ISSUES?

Did you know that Iowa ranks #9 in the country for oldest homes? Homes built before 1970 are likely to have lead, asbestos, and lack energy efficiency. In addition to older homes, housing can also be very expensive. In Linn County, 41% of renters struggle to pay their rent with over 30% of their income being spent on housing.

# **HOW IS UWECI ADDRESSING THIS ISSUE?**

With your support, we are working collaboratively with key community partners by being part of a community group called the Alliance for Equitable Housing, to develop solutions for affordable and quality housing.


# WHAT ARE THE ISSUES?

An average of 37% of households in Iowa are at or below the ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) threshold. These are households that are working, but do not earn enough to meet the costs of a basic household budget.
