SUPPORTING SAFETY NET SERVICES



Supporting **safety net services** means "catching" individuals and helping them bounce back if they fall onto hard times. UWECI does not want a family or individual to have one crisis that sets them back for years.

WHAT ARE THE ISSUES?

In July of 2024, 111 individuals were served by local emergency shelters, transitional housing facilities, or were found living on the streets in Linn County alone. In addition, 22,140 individuals in UWECI's five-county area are food insecure.

HOW IS UWECI ADDRESSING THIS ISSUE

With your support, UWECI, in collaboration with local community and nonprofit partners, plans to move forward with the National Alliance to End Homelessness recent recommendations for Linn County. We are also working to ensure a strong, stable, and accessible safety net to support individuals by educating and promoting 211.
