#### Fostering Childhood Success in Eastern Iowa

Focusing on childhood success is crucial in the early ages of childhood, and it doesn't end there. In our community, only 63% of children met the benchmark of being kindergarten ready and 85% of students in Linn County graduated high school.

At United Way, our focus is on shaping early childhood opportunities as well as our future workforce. We work with both community stakeholders and our nonprofit partners to develop strategies that assist both parents and children. In addition, we are aligning our work to support teens and young adults in their career path. Every child deserves the chance to reach their full potential. United Way clears the path to success, from early childhood through college and career.

Through our childhood success nonprofit partners, **1,806** children were impacted.



Around **89%** of children had improved socialemotional skills through early childhood and school aged programs.



#### The Opportunity Hub

Many at-risk youth lack awareness of career and college pathways, as well as the mentorship and support needed to succeed. The Opportunity Hub—a collaboration of the Cedar Rapids Community School District, Kirkwood Community College, UWECI, and local nonprofits—has developed a community-driven strategy to engage and inspire high-risk students.

This initiative focuses on coordinating career development experiences, aligning and enhancing existing programs, addressing gaps, and identifying students in crisis who lack support. The ultimate goal is to improve attendance, increase graduation rates, and ensure every student graduates with a college credit, certificate, or credential.
